CALL TO ORDER

Chief Parkinson – Incident Response with Autism Patient

Vice President Gorder introduced Chief Jon Parkinson with East Pierce Fire and Rescue. Chief Parkinson introduced Hannah Weaver, Firefighter. Developed a course for response to incidents patients with Autism. Shared screen, presentation on First Responders & Autism, How should First Responders interface with autistic individuals. Very near and close to her. She was diagnosed in 2020 with Level 2 Autism, a neurological disorder, born with it. Wants to bring awareness about autism. Learning what it is, what to look for, techniques and tools. Essentially a different brain in how processes, neurological difference in the brain. Can be genetic. Diana Caber, SS911 Communications Center Manager – Update on 988

President Stan Moffett introduced Diana Caber. Launched 988 yesterday. Introduced Courtney Ops Manager with Volunteers of America and Rachel Crisis Counselor on site 40 hours a week working on communications floor. Wed, Thur, Sat and Sun 2-midnight. Can connect with additional resources. Talking to a number of familiar callers and able to work with them on coping skills, follow-up care, etc. Also offering de-escalation when police or fire is enroute. A lot of layers and just starting up. Already getting positive feedback. 988 launched last July. Routed based on area code. Had a soft launch last week. Hard to know impact just yet with it with only a week in. Have job postings out now to bring on 2 -3 more people. It is currently a pilot program piloted through the Department of Health. The Association thanked them for their presentation. Great program.

What To Look For:

In The Field Reminders:

- Positional asphyxiation
- Caution with restraints

- Seizures
- ASD and epilepsy linked

- Elopement
- Drownings
- Paradoxical reaction to medication

- Interoception
- Alexithymia
- Altered responses to stimulus
- Difficulty communicating sensations/injuries

Misconceptions about Autism:

Through a Neurological Difference Lens:

Social Communication
Differences

Sensory Discomfort

Ambiguity

Depleted Internal Resources

Anxiety

Trauma

Low & Slow Technique:

LOW

Lower your body to at or below autistic individuals eye level
Lower your voice
Lower the complexity of your language; use shorter sentences

SLOW

Slow down your heart rate and breathing rate
Slow down your rate of speech
Slow down your movements
Slow down your own agenda

A.S.K. - What's In The Kit?

A bag containing numerous fidget toys, sunglasses, communication cards, dry erase boards, noise cancelling headphones, ID cards to provide the patient, and one 7lb weighted blankets.
